#### Welcome

## Joy

We have heard the Christmas story so many times sometimes it seems that we no longer hear it at all. We know about Mary and Joseph, the baby, the manger, the shepherds and the angels. In fact, Christmas is ubiquitous that sometimes it seems surprising to find out that Santa and Frosty were not present at that first Christmas.

But in all the hustle and bustle that Christmas has become, the increasingly frantic marketing attempts the closer the holiday comes, are all unable to help us understand the cosmic nature of Christmas. Tonight, through word and song, we would want to invite you to experience Christmas yet again in a new way – to remind ourselves that from the beginning and even now it has always been about Joy. That the baby whose birth we celebrate brings wholeness and peace in a world where often it seems like peace is a vague memory and wholeness a shadow of what was once real.

## **Advent Candle Lighting:**

O you who sit in darkness, with no hope of light and drunk with despair, look up. The light of the world in coming into your darkness; hope unearned and not deserved is coming. In the words of the prophet, arise for your light is come!<sup>iv</sup>

We light the first candle to remind us that we can trust God to bring light to our darkness and comfort to our loneliness.

Justice can be hard to come by. Many times what actually happened is obscured by a cloud of doubt and legalese to prevent justice. But the day is coming when a descendent of David will appear. The LORD's spirit will rest on him. He will not judge by mere appearances, or make decisions on the basis of hearsay. He will treat the poor fairly, and make right decisions.

We light the second candle in hope for when God's rule over all the world brings justice.

O God, you give us hope when all hope is gone. You love us despite our ungracious and self-centeredness. By giving us life, you bring your love to our lives. O Christ of God, come anew in our hearts this day, and remain in us forever.

We light the third candle to remind us of God's unfailing love for us

Now Jesus came to Nazareth, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and read where it was written, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and the regaining of sight to the blind, to set free those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." "For he is our peace." vi

We light the fourth candle remembering that your grace brings peace and joy to our world.

O God of grace, you bring us hope when all around is dark because of selfishness and exploitation. Tonight may we see your grace and the certainty of your love.

We light the Christ candle as we celebrate his grace that calls us to the good news of his peace. Let us worship the Light of the world who bring peace and light in our darkness.

Carol: What Child Is This? (This is an older text. There are some changes)<sup>vii</sup>
1 What child is this who, laid to rest, on Mary's lap is sleeping?
Whom angels greet with anthems sweet, while shepherds watch are keeping?
This, this is Christ the King, whom shepherds guard and angels sing;
Come, greet the infant Lord, the babe, the Son of Mary!

2 Why lies he in such low estate, where ox and ass are feeding? Good Christian, fear: for sinners here, the silent Word is pleading. Nails, spear, shall pierce him through, the cross be borne for me, for you; Hail, hail the Word made flesh, the babe, the Son of Mary!

## The Joy that was Creation

God saw all that he had made— and it was very good! There was evening, and there was morning, the sixth day. The heavens and the earth were completed with everything that was in them. By the seventh day God finished the work that he had been doing, and he ceased on the seventh day all the work that he had been doing. God blessed the seventh day and made it holy because on it he ceased all the work that he had been doing in creation.

"Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you possess understanding! Who set its measurements—if you know— or who stretched a measuring line across it? On what were its bases set, or who laid its cornerstone—when the morning stars sang in chorus, and all the sons of God shouted for joy?ix

## When Creation's Joy was Destroyed

The serpent said to the woman, "Surely you will not die, for God knows that when you eat from it your eyes will open and you will be like divine beings who know good and evil."

When the woman saw that the tree produced fruit that was good for food, was attractive to the eye, and was desirable for making one wise, she took some of its fruit and ate it. She also gave some of it to her husband who was with her, and he ate it. Then the eyes of both of them opened, and they knew they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made coverings for themselves.

Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the LORD God moving about in the orchard at the breezy time of the day, and they hid from the LORD God among the trees of the orchard.xi

For the creation eagerly waits for the revelation of the sons of God. For the creation was subjected to futility— not willingly but because of God who subjected it— in hope that the creation itself will also be set free from the bondage of decay into the glorious freedom of God's children.

For we know that the whole creation groans and suffers together until now. Not only this, but we ourselves also, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we eagerly await our adoption, the redemption of our bodies.xii

For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead also came through a man. For just as in Adam all die, so also in Christ all will be made alive.xiii

## Anticipating Joy – God becomes Human

The spirit of the sovereign LORD is upon me, because the LORD has chosen me. He has commissioned me to encourage the poor, to help the brokenhearted, to decree the release of captives, and the freeing of prisoners, to announce the year when the LORD will show his favor, the day when our God will seek vengeance, to console all who mourn, to strengthen those who mourn in Zion, by giving them a turban, instead of ashes, oil symbolizing joy, instead of mourning, a garment symbolizing praise, instead of discouragement. They will be called oaks of righteousness, trees planted by the LORD to reveal his splendor.xv

Now the birth of Jesus Christ happened this way. While his mother Mary was engaged to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph, her husband to be, was a righteous man, and because he did not want to disgrace her, he intended to divorce her privately.

When he had contemplated this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, because the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you will name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

This all happened so that what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet would be fulfilled: "Look! The virgin will conceive and bear a son, and they will call him Emmanuel," which means "God with us." xvi
